Student Roles and Responsibilities



Welcoming, caring, respectful and safe learning environments.

Students are entitled to welcoming, caring, respectful and safe learning environments that respect diversity and nurture a sense of belonging and a positive sense of self.

Section 31 of the Alberta Education Act outlines the responsibilities of students, including complying with the school's code of conduct and other rules, attending school regularly, and cooperating with school staff.

Section 31 of the Education Act states: A student, has the responsibility to:

- attend school regularly and punctually
- be ready to learn and actively engage in and diligently pursue the student's education
- ensure that the student's conduct contributes to a welcome, caring, respectful, and safe learning environment that respects diversity and fosters a sense of belonging
- respect the rights of others in the school
- refrain from, report, and not tolerate bullying or bullying behavior directed toward others in school, whether or not it occurs within the school building, during the school day, or be electronic means
- comply with the rules of the school and the policies of the board
- co-operate with everyone authorized by the board to provide education programs and other services
- be accountable to the student's teachers and other school staff for the student's conduct
- positively contribute to the student's school and community

Responsible Use of Technology Agreement

Responsible and Safe Use Agreement - Students



- I will follow my teacher's instructions when using devices in class.
- I will only use the division Wi-Fi when using my personal device(s) at school.
- I will stay on task and use the device for schoolwork or approved activities.
- I will ask permission to take pictures or videos in class and will not share without permission.
- I will stay safe online. I will visit trusted websites and use approved apps.
- I will keep my work and private information safe! I will use a strong password and log out of the device when I'm finished.
- I will only share my password with a trusted adult, including my teacher.
- I will be kind and respectful when I am online or using apps, and will protect my digital footprint!
- I will stand up to cyberbullying and will tell a trusted adult, including my teacher.
- I will respect my classmates' work (when working with others). I will not change or delete their work without permission. I will give positive, helpful feedback





Parent Role and Responsibilities



Section 32 of the Alberta Education Act: Right to Choose Education; Responsibilities of the Parent

Section 32 of the Alberta Education Act emphasizes the parental right to choose the kind of education for their children and their role as primary decision-makers in their child's education. It also highlights the responsibility of parents to be active partners in their child's education, ensuring their child attends school regularly and contributes to a positive learning environment.

- Parental Choice: choose the kind of education that shall be provided to the parent's child
- **Partner in Education:** Parents are considered partners in their child's education, with responsibilities that extend beyond simply enrolling their child in school.
- **Active Role**: Parents are responsible for taking an active role in their child's educational success.
- **Regular Attendance**: Ensuring regular school attendance is a key parent responsibility.
- **Positive Learning Environment**: Parents are expected to ensure their conduct contributes to a welcoming, caring, respectful, and safe learning environment.
- **Collaboration**: Parents are encouraged to cooperate and collaborate with school staff.

Alberta Provincial Cell Phone Policy



Cell Phone/Smart Watch/Tablet Usage

This policy will assist our school's compliance with Alberta Education's direction on the use of personal mobile devices and access to social media sites whole on school networks. This policy defines our roles and responsibilities as staff, students, and parents, and other members of our school community.

- No Cell Phone Use: students may not use cell phones/smart watches and tablets during instructional time
- If Brought To School: These devices must be on silent mode and secured in lockers during instructional time. If there is no locker assigned to a student, these devices must be powered off and stored in the student's backpack
- **Not permitted in these areas**: These devices are not to used in settings such as change rooms, washrooms, or private counselling rooms that have the potential to violate a person's reasonable expectation of privacy.

Medical Alert Information



On occasion parents ask school staff to administer medication to their child. In order to administer medication to a student, we require the following form to be completed and kept on file in the office:

Parent Parking is available:


- along the fence on 159 st

Message from Chief Supt Anderson



Welcome to the 2025-2026 school year! A <u>new school year</u> calls us to continue our Catholic educational journey, walking together intruth, goodness, and beauty. TRUTH. We are in the final year of our <u>Division Plan for Continuous Growth 2023-2026 (Year 3)</u>. At the heart of the plan is our mission to provide a Catholic education that inspires students to learn and that prepares them to live fully and to serve God in one another. Our priorities, as established by the Board of Trustees, continue to be: Living our Faith, Learning Excellence, Organizational Excellence, and Embracing Diversity. BEAUTY. At Edmonton Catholic Schools, we infuse our students with the beauty of the Catholic faith. In doing so, we hope to strengthen the relationship between school, home, and parish. As Father Paul says in <u>his letter</u>, "Together, home, school, parish, and Archdiocese, we unite in prayer for a year filled with learning, joy, and the peace of Christ."
