

We lay wreaths to honour and recognize the sacrifices that soldiers and those who supported soldiers made.


Every year, people lay wreaths at a Cenotaph, which is a large statue that names the soldiers who died in war from the city.

Charlotte Edith Anderson Monture

Edith Monture was a Mohawk First World War Veteran who served as a nurse in the war. She was one of the brave women who went overseas to support the war effort.





Henry Norwest



Henry Norwest was a Cree soldier from the Edmonton area. After the war started, he joined the war effort under the name of Henry Louie and was quickly sent off to Europe.

Norwest came to be the greatest marksman among Canadian troops and was one of the most successful snipers in the entire First World War.

Norwest was among thousands of brave First Nations, Métis, and Indigenous peoples to join and fight in the First World War.



John McCrae

John McCrae was a Canadian poet, physician, and soldier during the First World War.

He was responsible for running many hospitals which treated the wounded soldiers and helped many people recover from their injuries.

He wrote the now famous poem *In Flanders Fields* to remember his friends and fellow soldiers who had died.

The day before he wrote his famous poem, one of McCrae's closest friends was killed in the fighting and buried in a makeshift grave with a simple wooden cross. Wild poppies were already beginning to bloom between the crosses marking the many graves.

We're so happy to be back in the Studio after a break! The children have settled in beautifully and have been busy exploring, creating, and connecting with one another. Halloween brought a burst of excitement and imagination to our space — we celebrated by diving into the vibrant colors of the season like orange, black, green, and purple. The children danced to skeleton songs, joined in a joyful school-wide parade, sculpted pumpkins and silly faces with playdough, and discovered spiders and bugs in the water table. A heartfelt thank you to all the families who joined us for the parade and generously contributed sweet treats for the children to enjoy and take home. Your support helps make our Studio feel even more like a community!



This month we will be exploring the play topic of Connections, with a special focus on socialemotional development. Through play, conversations, and shared experiences, the children have been exploring what it means to connect — with themselves, each other, materials, and with their environment.

Guided by five reflective questions, I've been observing how children build relationships, express empathy, and navigate group dynamics. Guided by five reflective questions, I've been observing how children build relationships, express empathy, and navigate group dynamics.

- What materials can children use to explore and investigate ideas, thoughts, and questions about Connections?
- 2. Who in our community can children participate with to learn about Connections?
- 3. What ways can children imagine, create, and invent worlds that explore Connections?
- 4. What spaces might invite children to revisit, reshape, and rework theories and ideas connected to Connections?
- 5. How can we nurture children's caring for community, others and self through exploring Connections?

Discovery & Inquiry: Children created with playdough, making representations of themselves as well as other fictional characters.



Small World Play: Children use their imagination to create a play story, involving various loose parts.

It's about maintaining awareness of our thoughts, feelings, bodily sensations, and the surrounding environment.


Being mindful helps us pay attention and practice being present in the moment, instead of thinking about the past or the future.



Chief Superintendent Lynnette Anderson's November 2025 Message

Updated: November 3, 2025

I am writing this message shortly after students and teachers returned to the classroom on October 29, 2025.
